(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where the provision is dependent on -

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

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- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can be reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamourise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effect of drunkenness in any favourable manner .

2.

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

3.

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

4.

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5.

The responsible person shall ensure that -

(a) there any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka, whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Embedded Restrictions

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

The Designated Premises Supervisor will be a member of the local Pubwatch scheme is in existence.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

Any recorded music being played after the end of the permitted times for the sale of alcohol will be reduced to background level.

Signs will be displayed at exits requesting customers to leave quietly.

When live or recorded music is being provided, doors and windows will be kept closed.

Live and recorded music will cease at 23.00 hrs unless it can be demonstrated by the Licensee that sound from the premises will be inaudible within any noise sensitive premise, which has one or more windows open for ventilation. The test for fulfilment of this condition could include that sound from the premises is no more than barely audible at the boundary of nearby noise sensitive premises and the Licensee or his staff have made a regular noise survey to assess this.

Protection of Children from Harm

The licensee or his staff will require photographic proof of age of anyone seeking to purchase alcohol who appears to be under 20 years of age

Embedded Restrictions Restrictions

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of alcohol on the premises;
- b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- d) consumption of alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of alcohol so ordered;
- f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of alcohol so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premise`s.

Recorded Music

Premises licensed for the sale and supply of alcohol may provide, at any time, regulated entertainment by the reproduction of wireless, including television broadcast and of public entertainment by way of music and singing only which is provided solely by the reproduction of recorded sound.

Late Night Refreshment

The Licence may also provide and permit the consumption of late night refreshment for a period of 30 minutes after the permitted hours set out above, and on New Years Eve until 5am on New Years Day .

Premises with no children's certificate

No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of alcohol. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

General

The Prevention of Crime & Disorder

" CCTV to be installed in accordance with Home Office Guidelines relating to UK Police Requirements for Digital CCTV System.

" CCTV Images shall be retained for at least 28 days and except for mechanical breakdown beyond the control of the proprietor, shall be made available upon request to the police . Any breakdown or system failure will be notified to the police immediately & remedied as soon as practicable.

" It will be the responsibility of the DPS, or duty manager, to ensure that any request from the police for a recording to be made for evidential purposes, is carried out as soon as possible in compliance with data protection legislation.

" Spirits will be stored and displayed behind the servery.

Public Safety

- " The premises will operate a "Challenge 25" policy whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under 25 will be asked for photographic ID to prove their age.
- " The only forms of ID that will be accepted are passports, driving licences with a photograph or Portman Group, Citizen Card or Validate proof of age cards bearing the 'PASS' mark hologram. The list of approved forms of ID may be amended or revised with the prior written agreement of Sussex Police and the Licensing Authority without the need to amend the licence or conditions attaching to it.
- " Suitable and sufficient signage advertising the "Challenge 25" policy will be displayed in prominent locations in the premises.
- " All staff members engaged, or to be engaged, in selling alcohol on the premises shall receive the following training pertinent to the Licensing Act, specifically in regard to age-restricted sales, and the refusal of sales to persons believed to be under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.
- " Induction training must be completed, and fully documented, prior to the sale of alcohol by the staff member; and refresher training thereafter at intervals of no less than eight (8) weeks.
- " All age-restricted sales training undertaken by staff members shall be fully documented and recorded. All training records shall be made available to Sussex Police and the local Trading Standards Service upon request.
