(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can be reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamourise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effect of drunkenness in any favourable manner .

2.

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

4.

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5.

The responsible person shall ensure that -

(a) there any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka, whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

General

The Designated Premises Supervisor will spend a significant amount of time on the premises to oversee sales and will be contactable at all times should problems arise. All staff will be provided with training to promote responsible alcohol retailing. They will be instructed in the main issues of the 2003 Licensing Act.

The Prevention of Crime & Disorder

A CCTV system to be installed to the satisfaction of the Sussex Police, with cameras covering the alcohol displays, the counter and the entrance, with image storage for at least 28 days. That evidence to be made available to police immediately upon reasonable request.

A refusals recording mechanism, either book or computer, shall be maintained at the premises .

Staff will be subjected to training and regular re-training regarding the prevention of sales to or on behalf of underage persons and to drunk persons. These training inputs shall be recorded and signed for by the trainee, and records made available to police officers, police community support officers, and licensing officers.

The shop shall be well lit, with spirits and most wines stored behind the counter. People considered to be displaying anti-social behaviour ie noisy, drunk or violent, will not be served .

Public Safety

Spirits which could be flammable will be stored away from exit points, and staff will be provided with training in case of fire.

A panic button will be installed for staff as a panic measure .

People considered to be drunk or violent will not be served.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

People displaying anti-social behaviour will not be served.

Staff will be instructed about social responsibilities relating to the retail sale of alcohol, and appropriate strategies that can be adopted to prevent or eliminate alcohol related crime and conflict.

The Protection of Children from Harm

No alcohol will be sold to people under the age of 18 (relevant I.D. will be required). Alcohol will not be sold if it is suspected that it will be consumed by under 18s.
