



CENSUS 2001 & 2011

ETHNIC GROUPS

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BACKGROUND

Data from both the 2001 and 2011 National Census are shown in this report and comparisons made between the two.

Inclusion and comment in the main text of the report are only shown for those ethnic groups that account for 1% or higher of the total usual resident population in either Adur and Worthing. More detailed data is shown in the appendices.

All of the Ethic Group data mentioned above and additional data from both the 2001 and 2011 National Census are shown on the joint Adur District Council and Worthing Borough Council web site at:

Note throughout this report the 'White; English/Welsh/Scottish/Northern Irish/British' ethnic group will be referred to as 'White; British' for ease of use.

LOCAL AUTHORITY LEVEL

Overview

In both Adur and Worthing the largest ethnic group was 'White; British' for both 2001 and 2011.

The proportion of ethnic minority groups increased in both Adur and Worthing from 2001 to 2011. The greatest increase was seen in Worthing.

From these figures it can be seen that in 2011 just over one in ten people in the Worthing population were from an ethnic minority group and that the proportion of ethnic minorities nearly doubled in Worthing from 2001 to 2011.

The three largest ethnic groups in both Adur and Worthing in 2001 and 2011 were:

- White; British
- White; Other White
- Asian/Asian British; Other Asian

More detail regarding each of these groups is shown on the next few pages.

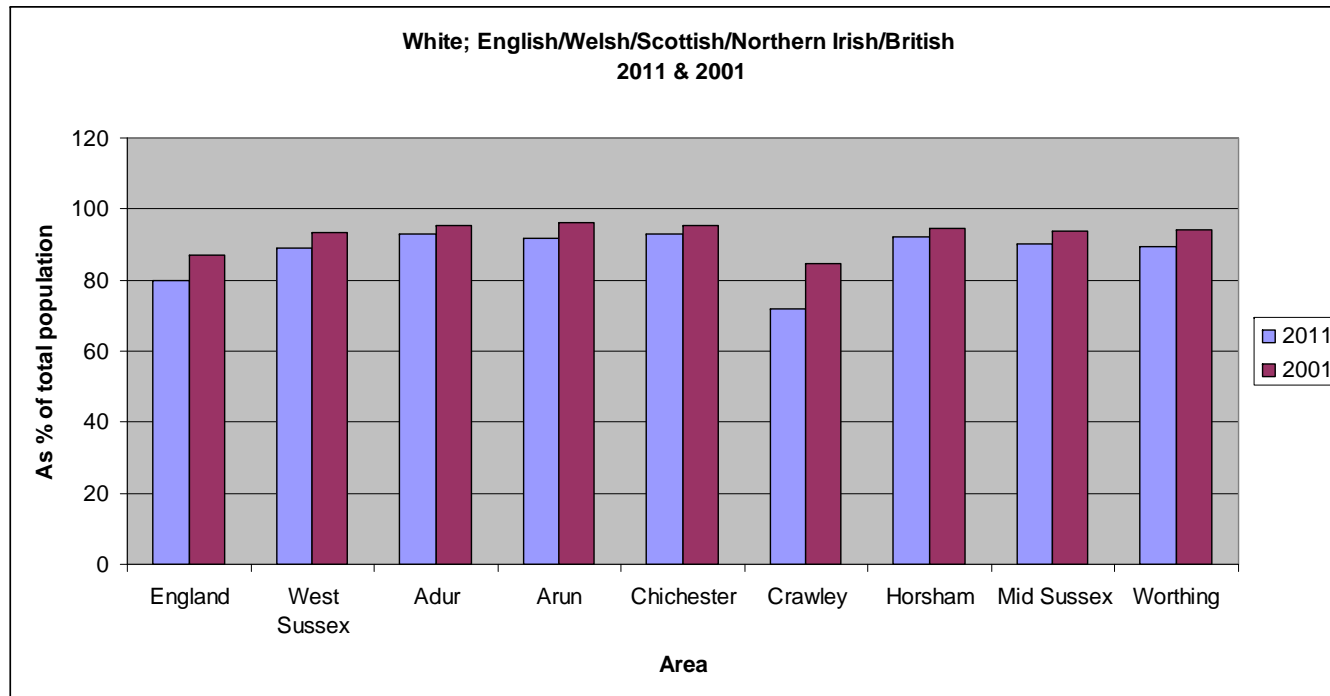

Key Facts

- Between 2001 and 2011 all local Authorities in West Sussex saw a reduction in the proportion of the ethnic group 'White; British' in their populations.
- The biggest reduction in the 'White; British' population between 2001 and 2011 occurred in Crawley with a 12.4% reduction.
- Worthing saw a 4.7% reduction, (second highest in the County) and Adur a 2.6% reduction.
- For 2011 Worthing had the second lowest population proportion of 'White; British' in West Sussex, 89.4%. (Crawley had the lowest, 72.1%).
- For 2011 Adur had the sixth highest proportion in the County for this ethnic group at 92.9%. (Only Chichester had higher with 93.0%).



Graph clearly shows that:

- There had been a decrease in the ethnic group White; British population in all local authorities in West Sussex between 2001 and 2011.
- Adur had the highest proportion of this ethnic group for any local authority in West Sussex and Crawley had the lowest in both 2001 and 2011.
- Crawley shows the biggest decrease in this ethnic group from 2001 to 2011.

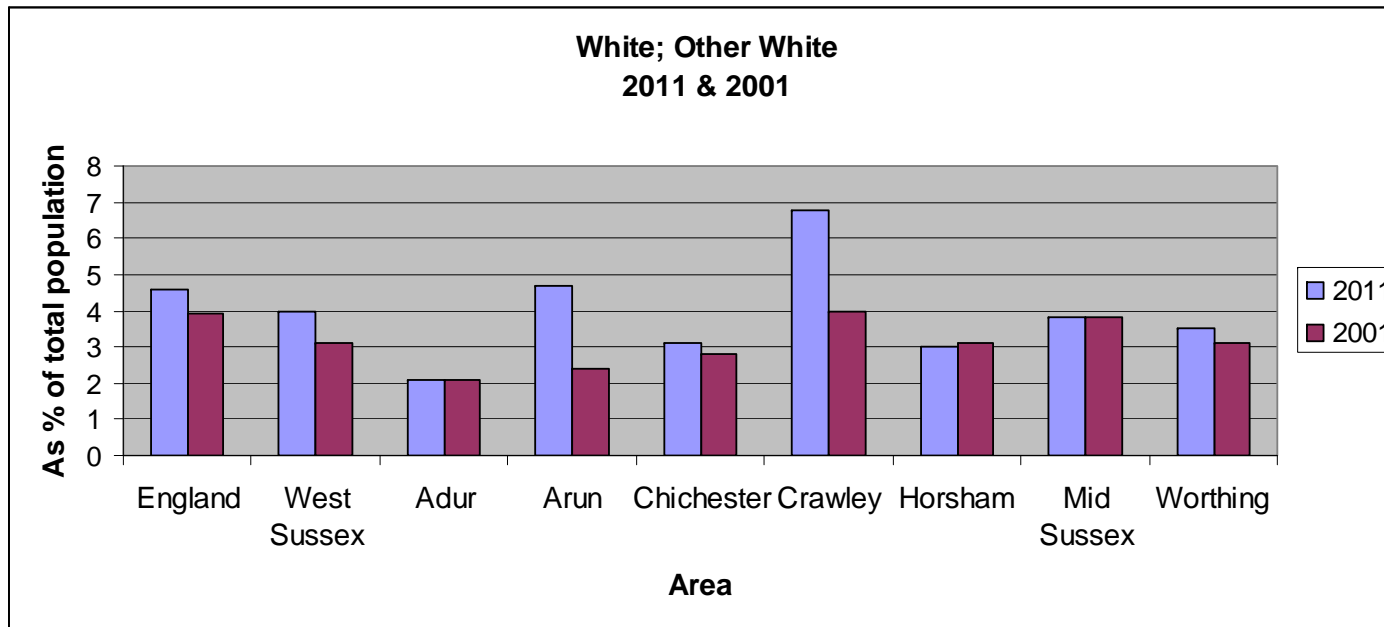

Key Facts

- Crawley saw the biggest increase in West Sussex of the ethnic group 'White; Other White' from 2001 to 2011 at 2.8%. Arun saw the second largest increase, 2.3%.
- The ethnic group 'White; Other White' for Worthing increased slightly (0.4%) from 2001 to 2011. The population of 'White; Other White' remained the same for Adur.
- For 2011 Worthing had the fourth highest population proportion of 'White; Other White' in West Sussex, 3.5%. (Crawley had the highest, 6.8%).
- For 2011 Adur had the lowest proportion of 'White; Other White' in West Sussex at 2.1%.



The graph above clearly shows that:

- For Adur the ethnic group 'White, other White' remained the same from 2001 to 2011.
- Crawley showed the biggest increase in the proportion of this ethnic group from 2001 to 2011 in West Sussex. Arun also showed a significant increase.
- Worthing also saw a slight increase in the proportion of this ethnic group from 2001 to 2011, 3.1 to 3.5%.
- Horsham was the only local authority in West Sussex to see a reduction in this ethnic group between 2001 and 2011 Census.

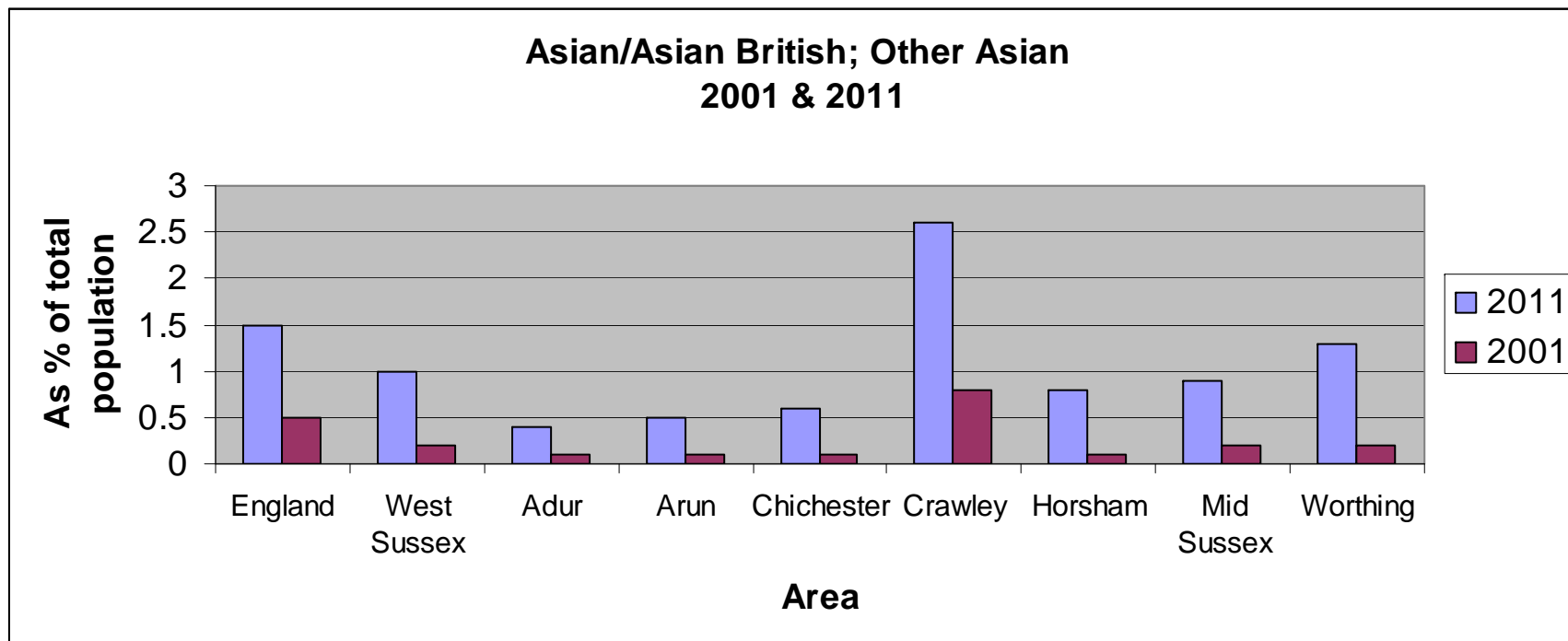

Key Facts

- All local authorities in West Sussex saw an increase from 2001 to 2011 in the ethnic group 'Asian/Asian British; Other Asian'.
- Crawley saw the greatest increase and Worthing the second greatest increase in the County from 2001 to 2011 for this ethnic group.
- For 2011 Worthing had the second highest population of 'Asian/Asian British; Other Asian' in the County, 1.3%. (Crawley had the highest at 2.6%).
- For 2011 Adur had the lowest population of 'Asian/Asian British; Other Asian' in the County at 0.4%.



The graph above clearly shows that:

- All figures for this ethnic group are relatively low, with the exception of Crawley.
- The proportion of the 'Asian/Asian British; Other Asian' population had increased in England, West Sussex and all of the local authorities in West Sussex from the 2001 to the 2011.
- The greatest increase was seen in Crawley.
- Worthing showed the second largest increase for any local authority in West Sussex for this ethnic group.
- Adur showed the lowest proportion and lowest increase of this ethnic group for any local authority in West Sussex.

WARD LEVEL DATA

ADUR

Figures for any ethnic groups except 'White; British' were very low in Adur in both 2001 and 2011. Because of this full data is not shown in this report. Full data can be viewed at:

Three small points of consideration though are that:

- Marine Ward had a slightly higher than average percentage as compared to the rest of Adur for the ethnic group 'White; Other White', 2.3% in 2001 rising to 3% in 2011 (district average in 2011 is 2.1%).
- In 2011 St. Mary's Ward and Southlands Ward had a slightly higher than average population of 'Asian/Asian British; Bangladeshi'. For St. Mary's Ward in 2001 and 2011 1.3% of the population were from this ethnic group. In Southlands Ward in 2001 1.1% of the population were from this ethnic group rising slightly to 1.3% in 2011. (The average for the District in 2011 was 0.4%).

- In 2011 Central Ward had the lowest percentage of 'White; British' in Worthing at 79.7%. Selden had the second lowest at 83.2% and Heene the third lowest at 85%.
- In 2011 Central Ward had the largest proportion of 'White: Other' ethnic group in Worthing, 7.3% closely followed by Heene Ward, 6.2% and then Selden Ward at 5.3%.

- The ethnic group White:Other increased in all wards in Worthing from 2001 to 2011.
- The 'White; Other' ethnic group increased by 102.8% in Central Ward between 2001 and 2011, 94% in Heene Ward and 71% in Selden Ward.

Other ethnic groups above 2% of total Worthing ward populations in 2011 are:

- Selden Ward 4.0% for Asian/Asian British; Other Asian
- Central Ward 3.0% for Asian/Asian British; Other Asian
- Central Ward 2.2% for Asian/Asian British; Indian.
