Since 2016 our funding from central government has been cut by 50%, making it harder to deliver the essential services our residents rely on.

Despite these challenges, Worthing Borough Council remains focused on delivering - ensuring that vital services can continue to be run as sustainably as possible and in partnership with our communities.

This year we are developing a long-term strategy to ensure the pier, lido and seafront are protected and enhanced for future generations. Work will soon begin at Union Place, unlocking much-needed regeneration in this part of town, while Montague Gardens will be created - turning the heart of our town into a greener, more vibrant and welcoming space.

From waste collection to maintaining our parks, supporting local businesses and protecting our most vulnerable residents, we are working hard to make every penny count. Our teams are dedicated to ensuring cleaner streets, safer public spaces and a well-maintained environment for everyone who lives and works here.

At the same time, we remain committed to supporting those most in need. We continue to invest in emergency and temporary accommodation while prioritising homelessness prevention, ensuring as many people as possible can remain in their homes.

Through innovation, collaboration and careful financial planning, we will continue to deliver the services on which you, our communities, depend. As your local council, our mission is clear: to provide high-quality services, invest in the future, and build a town that works for everyone.


