

The Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 Worthing Borough Council Public Spaces Protection Order 2022

Number 3: Overnight Camping

The Borough Council of Worthing is satisfied that overnight camping in a public place is being carried out within the area to which this Order applies or it is likely that this activity will be carried out and this is having or is likely to have a detriment effect on the quality of life of those in the locality and therefore makes this Public Spaces Protection order ("PSPO") covering the matters set out below.

This PSPO relates to that land outlined in red on the attached map and which are briefly described in the Schedule.

The activities set out in this order are prohibited or required only where an authorised person requires a person to stop the activity or requires that person to do something set out in this Order.

- An authorised person means a constable, a police community support officer or a person authorised in writing by the Borough Council of Worthing.
- A public place means any place to which the public or any section of the public has access, on payment or otherwise, as of right or by virtue of express or implied permission.
- 1. The activities which are prohibited by this PSPO are;
- a. All persons shall not be permitted to remain overnight in any vehicle or a temporary structure that is designed or intended to provide shelter or accommodation.
- b. If instructed to do so by an authorised officer a person shall clear away any vehicle, temporary structure and/or associated paraphernalia without delay.
- 2. Any person who fails without reasonable excuse to comply with this order shall commit an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Level 3 on the standard scale.
- 3. This PSPO shall come into effect on 20 August 2022
- 4. This PSPO shall have effect or a period of 3 years

Appeals — In accordance with section 66 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 ("the Act"), any interested person who wishes to challenge the validity of the Order on the grounds the Council did not have the power to make the Order or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, may apply to the High Court within six weeks from the date on which this Order is made. An interested person is an individual who lives in the specified area or who regularly works or visits that area.
