

Checklist for hiring and operating an inflatable

Inflatables such as bouncy castles can be dangerous if they are not maintained, set up and/or used correctly.

To help you to ensure your event is safe we have included a basic check list with some of the health and safety matters you will need to consider in relation to the operation of inflatables. This is not an exhaustive list and the company providing your bouncy castle should provide you with further instructions.

The role of the supervisor		
The rules for those using the inflatable (e.g. age limit, number of people allowed on at one time, if shoes can be worn, etc.)		
Supervisors and the responsible person at the event know how to safely operate the inflatable (This includes knowing how to monitor weather conditions, how to make sure the inflatable is operating correctly and what to do if it's not, action to take if they spot a hazard)

The weather report for the day of event has been checked regularly in

Do you know what weather conditions make it unsafe to use the inflatable? (In strong and or gusting winds inflatables can blow away resulting in		
Serious injury or the death of those playing on it) An anemometer is available to use on the day to measure wind speed?		
(An anemometer <u>must</u> be used to measure wind speed, weather apps on phones and forecasts are not sufficient)		

If the answer to any of the questions above is <u>no</u>, you may not be able to safely operate the inflatable. Please contact the company providing the inflatable for further instruction or Adur & Worthing Council for further advice.
