

Low Income Family Tracker Worthing household data May 2023


Who is on the Low Income Family Tracker in Worthing? May 2023 data.

- The total number of households is 6347 in May 23 which is 29 households less than in April 23. The trend is for the number of households has been to decrease.
- The largest household type are single households 4561 households (71.9%)
- 3052 households (48.1%) have someone living in the household claiming a disability benefit. The
 proportion of households claiming a disability benefit has increased over the last year from 46.6%
 of households in May 22.
- The main tenure type are social tenants 2149 (33.9%) closely followed by private tenants 1904 (30%)
- Supported housing make up 10.5% of the dataset. In May 23 this was 669 households. In May 22 it was 9.2% of the dataset and consisted of 620 households.
- The number of households in temporary accommodation in May 23 was 261 households. The trend has been for this figure to increase month on month over the past year and was 236 households in May 22, an increase of 10.6%
- 697 (11%) households are in all four poverty categories (food, fuel, relative and water poverty)
















Relative poverty and food poverty



Fuel poverty and water poverty












Top 5 wards in Worthing in relative poverty in LIFT households

Top 5 wards in Worthing in food poverty in LIFT households




Food poverty is calculated as when a household's total minimum acceptable food expenditure (based on the Minimum income standard) is higher than their income after "priority costs"


Top 5 wards in Worthing in fuel poverty in LIFT households
