# **WASTE CLEARED IN SOMPTING**

We've begun our next round of waste amnesties in the local community - with around 1.3 tonnes of unwanted items removed in one day in Sompting.

Thank you to all our residents for leaving their bulky waste where we asked them to so it could be cleared away.

We'll tell you when a waste amnesty will happen in your neighbourhood so please keep an eye out for dates near you.



# **MAINTENANCE WORK**

Since the summer we have been looking at all of our properties to draw up a list of improvement work that is needed.

This includes window and door replacement, heating upgrades, roofing works, kitchen and bathroom replacements and decorative work.

As soon as we have confirmed when we will be doing work, we will tell you.

We want to do this as quickly as we can, so although this will take some time to complete, in the coming months you will see lots more work being done in your area than in previous years.



### **FIRE SAFETY**

You may be aware that in September we had a fire at Warren Court in Lancing which was caused by items left in a communal area.

Thankfully no one was seriously injured but this could have been far worse.

It's vital that walkways, stairways, hallways and other shared areas in our blocks are kept clear of any items, both because they are a fire risk and because they could prevent you and your neighbours escaping in an emergency.

If we find any items in communal areas, we will remove them and may bill the owner for us taking them away and getting rid of them.

Separately, in October there was a fire in Nelson Close caused by a tumble dryer. Please remember to ensure they are maintained and that filters are regularly cleaned as otherwise they could also catch fire.
