

GOVERNMENT DEVOLUTION PLANS

- A government plan to give more powers and funding to local areas.
- The intended benefits are to **strengthen local economies** through devolved powers and **improve public services**.
- The government is serious about this and its **timescales to deliver** are ambitious!



WHAT IS DEVOLUTION?



After devolution Current Transfers powers **Central Government** and access to Controls national-level decision making better funding Strategic authorities **Central Government** New regional duties and powers in: Controls many things that have local impacts - Funding and investment e.g. regional transport networks, regional Transport and local infrastructure planning decisions Skills and employment Housing and planning Economic development · Environment and climate change · Health and wellbeing Public safety Local councils Local councils Can only raise money through council tax Have representatives at the strategic authority, and have little say in regional decisions so can influence policy



WHAT IS REORGANISATION?

- Unitary authorities broadly cover all the services that county & district councils have
- Most of the country has unitary authorities already
- Reorganisation involves combining services across counties & districts









The government has identified Sussex & Brighton as a priority area for devolution



Joint devolution & reorganisation plan for Sussex & Brighton by end of September



Elections for Sussex Mayor and new regional authority in 2026 and elections for unitaries in 2027

Mid April	End date for devo consultation
September	Business case on new unitary to government
Jan-April 2026	Government decision on business case
May 2026	first mayoral elections
May 2027	New unitary elections
May 2028	New council 'live'
