Worthing CIL Neighbourhood Fund case study: Worthing Heritage Alliance - Goring heritage leaflets

Two new leaflets that celebrate the history of Goring have been unveiled to an audience of residents and local schoolchildren at Goring Library.

Worthing Heritage Alliance was awarded just over £4,800 from our Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Neighbourhood Fund to produce a heritage trail leaflet that residents can use to undertake their own walking tours, and one that celebrates one of Goring's most notable residents - nature writer Richard Jefferies.

Both leaflets were created by local historian Chris Hare, who grew up in Goring. Chris gave a talk on the history of Goring with images comparing Goring past and present to pupils at his old school, Goring-by-Sea C of E Primary School.



Quotes from some of the children's reactions to the talk are featured in the heritage trail leaflet, including this one from Year 5 pupil Wakeley: *"I found looking at the old photographs really interesting and cool, because I drive past there every day."*
