Who is liable to pay?

We decide who is to pay Council Tax depending on who is the main occupier of the property.

- If the freeholder lives in the property, he or she is usually liable for the Council Tax.
- If the leaseholder lives in the property, he or she is usually liable for the Council Tax.
- If there is a tenant living in the property, he or she is usually liable for the Council Tax.
- If there is a resident with a licence to live in the property, he or she is usually liable for the Council Tax.
- If none of the above apply, any other resident is liable for the Council Tax.

Properties left empty and unfurnished may be exempt from Council Tax for up to one month.

After this, the full charge will be due.

Properties which are furnished but empty will receive no discount.
