As a public sector, we have a duty to publish statistics about the number of new apprentices we have in our organisation.

The information below shows the figures **from 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019**

Number of employees who were working in England on 31 March 2018:	<b>718</b>
Number of employees who were working in England on 31 March 2019:	<b>717</b>
Number of new employees who started working for you in England between 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019:	<b>89</b>
Number of apprentices who were working in England on 31 March 2018:	<b>5</b>
Number of apprentices who were working in England on 31 March 2019:	<b>11</b>
Number of new apprentices in England between 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019 (includes both new hires and existing employees who started an apprenticeship):	<b>6</b>
Percentage of apprenticeship starts (both new hires and existing employees who started an apprenticeship) as a proportion of employment starts between 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019:	<b>6.74%</b>
Percentage of total headcount that were apprentices on 31 March 2019:	<b>1.53%</b>
