(These are only examples, and you must tell us about any change that you think may affect your Council Tax.)

- 1 A single person no longer qualifies for a Council Tax discount because they do not live alone.
- 2 A change of address. Please tell us:
 - your old address;
 - the name of the person who has moved into your old address;
 - the date you vacated (left) your old address;
 - your new address;
 - the date you moved into your new address;
 - whether you are the owner or the tenant of this property;
 - · if the property is furnished or unfurnished; and
 - · your solicitor's name and address.
- 3 A child reaching 18.
- 4 A change of name, for example, if you get married.
- 5 A person becoming, or no longer being, a student.
- 6 A person who is no longer entitled to be 'disregarded'. (When a person is disregarded, the person who pays the Council Tax may be entitled to a discount.)

A person is no longer disregarded if they:

- have just returned home from prison;
- no longer need to be cared for;
- have just returned home from receiving care; or
- have returned home as they no longer need to provide care elsewhere.
- 7 A property that no longer qualifies for an exemption.

This could include a property that:

- is lived in, for example, after alteration or repairs;
- has been empty for more than one month: or
- people are living in.

We may contact you again if we need further details.

Remember to tell us about any change in your circumstances that may affect your Council Tax. If the Council Tax account was in joint names, please give below the name and address of the person that any refund should be paid to if you do not hold a joint bank account.
